S No 2

A sentence is a group of words that makes complete sense.

Examples: I like this place.

My sister returned from her field trip.

We salute our soldiers.

A sentence may:

- i. state a simple fact. (The sun is a star.)
- ii. ask a question. (How is the climate in Chennai?)
- iii. express a request, command or advice, etc. (Please take your seat.)
- iv. express a wish or sudden feeling. (What a pleasant surprise!)

Accordingly, we have four different kinds of sentences.

- i. **Assertive Sentence:** This kind of sentence makes a statement. It can be positive or negative. It starts with a capital letter (like all other sentences) and ends with a full stop (.).

Examples: Dinosaurs have been extinct for millions of years. (positive)

All animals do not hibernate in winter. (negative)

- ii. **Interrogative Sentence:** An interrogative sentence asks a question. It ends with a question mark (?).

Examples: Do you know where he has gone?

What have you done?

- iii. **Imperative Sentence:** An imperative sentence expresses a request, gives a command, an advice or makes a suggestion. These sentences end with a full stop (.).

Examples: 1. Please bring me a cup of tea.

You should exercise daily.

2. Do not paint the walls.

Let us go for a walk.

- iv. **Exclamatory Sentence:** An exclamatory sentence expresses a strong feeling. It ends with an exclamation mark (!).

Examples: What a fantastic film that was!

I wish I were a bird!
