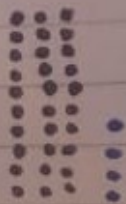

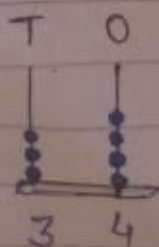

Place Value \Rightarrow The numbers 34 and 43 have two digits - 3 and 4. The digits are in different places in the two numbers. So they have different values. The position of a digit in a number gives it a place value.



3 tens and 4 ones
make 34

$$30 + 4 = 34$$



tens	ones
3	4

So, in 34, 3 is in the tens place, 4 is in the ones place.
